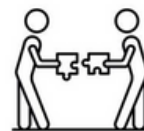

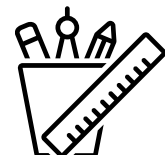

Our Mission

The CLC Projects Ashtabula County is dedicated to the development, support, and creation of Community Learning Centers (CLCs) in area schools to provide services and programs for all students, families, and the community so that all can be successful in school and in life.

The Partnership

CLC Projects Ashtabula County is a partnership between the Ashtabula County Community Action Agency and the Ashtabula County Educational Services Center to implement the expansion of CLCs in Ashtabula County.

Expansion efforts work to:

- establish within the area schools a CLC to serve as a community hub, to provide educational, recreational, cultural, health, and social services;
- improve coordination, integration, accessibility, and effectiveness of support services for children and families, and;
- address the non-academic conditions that negatively affect a student's ability to come to school "ready-to-learn".

The CLC will leverage community partner support to address the barriers to student achievement in a thorough and cost-effective manner that is complimentary to the academic vision.

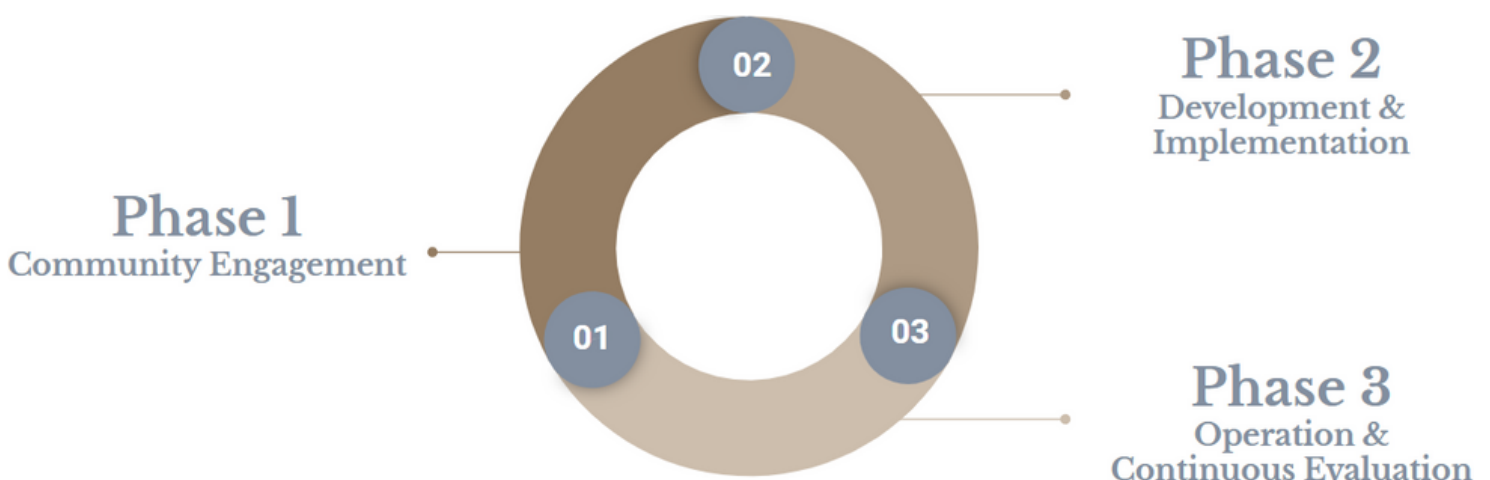


The Overall Process

The establishment of each CLC will follow a mutually agreed upon process that is developed based upon existing best practices and proven CLC implementation strategies.

This includes but is not limited to:

- Conducting an assessment of the needs, wants, and values of the District or School stakeholders through a Community Engagement Process (CE Process);
- Collection and analysis of CE Process results, and presentation of results to the District or School and stakeholders;
- Development of goals, priorities, and a plan for implementation using results of the CE Process;
- Initiating or facilitating action steps based upon results of the CE Process, and;
- Oversight, consultation, and/or administration of the CLC operation in collaboration with the District or School as appropriate.

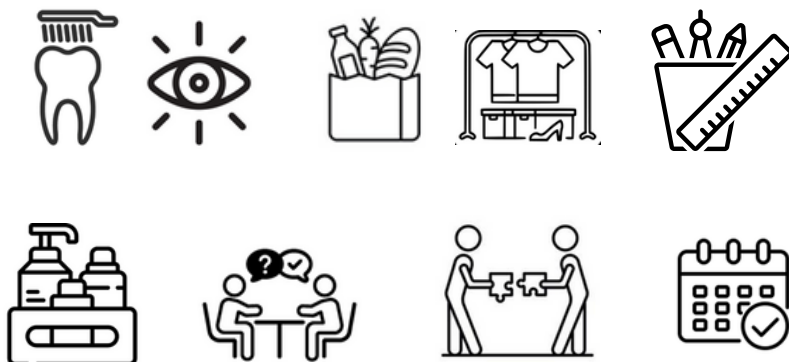

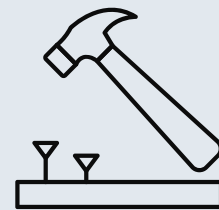
The Pony Stall
